Student Achievements



- We had 14 students Graduate in 2021 except one who missed out by 1 point all the rest achieved a QCE, 8 out of 14 are enrolled into further education
- Schools Constitutional Convention: Student representing NQ to Nationals 7 years in a row
- QATSIF: 16 students (Yrs 11& 12) are on this scholarship, Year 10 and 11 students and families have received notification about this application for the next round.
- 6 x elected leaders including our College Captain are Indigenous
- 2 x Yr 11/12 students will be on school based traineeships
